In November the water will be turned off to most of the camp in preparation for freezing and snow conditions. The exception is Cedars, which we keep open all year. We do have some things to do inside the Cedars. There are some outside tasks that can be done in November and December, it just depends on the weather.

Workday tasks for October 19th

Bring string trimmers, Leaf blowers and chainsaw if you have one.

- -Replace 4 toilets in the Cedars
- -Replace one small window in the Cedars
- -Light fixtures need to be cleaned
- -Cut logs into manageable sections
- -Remove sheets of steel from the Lodge basement
- -Take down Scaffolding next to Cedars
- -Remove one furnace In Cedar's (prepare for new furnace to be installed)
- -Install electric panel and receptacles in small cabin

We need one or two who are willing to get on the roof of the shelters to remove the years of debris; leaves and sticks in preparation for a new roof.
